MAKING NOISE – COMMUNITY PROTEST - PROPOSED ORGANIC WASTE STATION, LIDCOMBE



Lidcombe residents are making their noise – they do not want the proposed development of an Organic Waste Transfer Station at 109A Church Street, Lidcombe.

Many residents are speaking out and engaging with people in the Lidcombe area to highlight this proposal. Members of the community were vocal that they do not want this proposed development to proceed.

Of course, it's not just immediate residential locals that will be disadvantaged. People who travel to Lidcombe, children at the primary schools, attendees at the local Churches, aged care facilities, commercial sites – particularly the outdoor dining, medical facilities and child care centres will be affected in different ways.

The odours will no doubt waft and have a diabolical effect on people – particularly those with health issues. Who wants to live and have these odour and traffic issues as the backdrop to their facilities?

Residents are working as a collective and felt there was the need to make noise, without the politics of others and did so at Lidcombe Railway Station, expressing concerns. Enough is enough. Lidcombe deserves better.
