Dear [Cumberland Council],

I am writing this letter to express my objection to the proposed development of an Organics Transfer Station (OTS) at 109A Church Street in Lidcombe. Having reviewed the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and considered the potential implications of the project, I firmly believe that the establishment of this facility will have detrimental effects on the community and on the environment.

One of the primary concerns is the significant increase in noise, odour, and traffic that the proposed transfer station would generate.
