, as well as myself, to voice our objections to the proposed organic waste transfer station for 109A Church Street,

Our family has lived in the Lidcombe area since the 1800's and have consequently seen and experienced many, many changes - both good and not so good - during that time. We remember clearly the bad odours that wafted over Lidcombe last century from the old cattle yards at Flemington and the Valvoline factory at Silverwater when there was little consideration of the impact on residents.

In recent years it has been delightful to see the adjacent remediation and development of Olympic Park and Camellia, as well as the old Lidcombe Hospital site, so that finally this convenient, well located area is able to lose the dumping ground image it previously received.

Now, however, council is considering a totally inappropriate proposal for a large, private, organic waste transfer station in an area close to multiple residential areas and developments housing many children. Children who are our future. Not only will this increase substantially the traffic our local roads receive but it will also bring continuous heavy vehicle traffic, with the resulting noise, odour and nuisance, as well as damaging our traffic structures requiring additional maintenance and subsequent costs.

We had been expecting to hear that the site would be re-zoned and developed as residential apartments, being so conveniently located close to public transport and major roads.
