My professional background is in High Voltage Electrical Distribution maintenance and supply, But I am currently employed in the planning and delivery of Major Rail Transport projects for the New South Wales State Government and in that capacity, I can fully understand the issues that residents would be concerned of due to this project.

One of the major issues as I see it is that the adjacent residential areas have a high percentage of people living in apartments with a severe lack of street parking and this project will expose them to higher levels of dust and noise pollution with the potential to cause severe medical issues for families who have children with respiratory conditions in the area.
