I am writing to express my strong objection to the proposed construction of a waste transfer station near my home, as currently being assessed by the Cumberland Council. As a concerned resident of Lidcombe, I believe that this development will have significant negative impacts on our community and environment.

With a projected 118 truck movements daily, our local roads, especially the narrow entry road, will experience heightened congestion. Moreover, the close proximity of the proposed waste transfer station to residential areas raises serious concerns.
