Dear Cumberland City Council,

I strongly object to the proposed development of an organic waste transfer station at 109A Church Street, Lot 1 DP 778492. File DA2023/0130.

The proposed waste station would bring significant noise and odour to the community as it is too close to residences and community areas including Lidcombe Public School and Phillips Park, nursing homes and child care centres.

There are new apartments being constructed in this area, thus already being congested with traffic. Traffic is going to be even more horrendous with 59 trucks per day which is 118 truck movements.

Cumberland should be a lovely place to live with many assets to be proud of. However, a waste station so close to a densely populated residential area and crucial community areas would introduce dust fumes and strong offensive odour which would be unpleasant, off-putting and significantly impact the health of residents, particularly children and the elderly.

We should prioritise the safety and peace of our neighbourhood over such a development.

I implore the council to consider the negative impacts on the community set out in this letter when assessing the DA.

As a long-time resident of Cumberland council, I strongly believe that a waste transfer station does not belong in our community, and I request the Council to reject this proposal in the best interest of Cumberland residents.
