I have watched Lidcombe transform from an ordinary suburb without much going for it except a good train line into a vibrant suburb that now also has a strong restaurant/café culture, a good local shopping centre, the Dooleys Club which has been upgraded over the years and is now undergoing another upgrade and lots of new houses being built in the area.
