I am writing to strongly object to the proposed development application (DA2023/0130) for an organic waste transfer plant at 109A Church St, Lidcombe. As both a local worker and resident in close proximity to the proposed site, I am deeply concerned about the significant impact this development will have on both my daily life and the overall well-being of the community.

The proximity of the proposed plant to residential areas, including my own residence, raises serious concerns regarding pollution and air quality. Organic waste transfer plants are known to emit odors and potentially hazardous substances, which can have detrimental effects on the surrounding environment and the health of residents. As a resident, I am deeply worried about the potential decline in air quality and the negative impact it will have on my living environment.
