I am writing to express my strong OBJECTION to the proposed construction and operation of an organic waste transfer station at 109A Church Street, Lidcombe, NSW 2141 (Lot 1 DP 778492), as outlined in File: DA2023/0130. I firmly believe that this project would have several negative impacts on our neighbourhood and significantly compromise the quality of life for its residents.

Firstly, the establishment of an organic waste transfer station in such close proximity to residential areas raises grave concerns about potential health risks.
