Dear Cumberland Council,

I am writing to express my strong objection to the proposed development application (DA2023/0130) for an organic waste transfer plant at 109A Church St, Lidcombe. As a resident living near the proposed site, I am deeply concerned about the significant impact it will have on pollution and air quality in the area.

The close proximity of the plant to residential zones (only 70 meters away) raises serious concerns about the potential deterioration of air quality. Organic waste transfer plants are known to emit odors and potentially hazardous substances, which can adversely affect the health and well-being of nearby residents, including myself. Additionally, the narrowness of the road leading to the site makes it unsuitable for heavy truck traffic associated with a waste transfer plant.
