Hello, my name is F and I live in Lidcombe, and I am very concerned about the proposed organic waste transfer station at 109A Church St Lidcombe.

My biggest concern is this tip is simply too close to residential homes, only about 100 meters from houses (see image attached). This is across a railway line, clear space as opposed to buildings or other obstructions which block noise, meaning the residents will likely be affected by extra noise. They also might be subjected to excess vibration and odours depending on operations or future expansions.

The operating hours of the tip are excessive, and beyond what is in the Cumberland Development Control Plan. The operating hours will be 6am - 10pm Monday - Friday and 8am - 6pm on Saturday. However the DCP says that operation is only allowed 7am - 6pm Monday to Saturday. Having garbage trucks trundling past 100m away from your house at 10pm is definitely not ideal. Also, if there was ever a dangerous situation such as a fire or hazardous material leak, houses are close enough that they may have to be evacuated.

The traffic capacity can't handle an extra 118 trucks per day. This is right on the edge of an industrial area, right next to a residential area. This isn't in the middle of a vast industrial area, on a main arterial road. This is not a suitable location to be processing large amounts of waste. Church St, which connects houses, churches and schools, would become more noisy and dangerous, as this is the only road trucks can take to and from the plant.

A more suitable location should be found. This location is too close to houses and is entirely unsuitable for the amount of waste and trucks proposed.
