**Objection to the development , DA20230130, Site 109A Church St Lidcombe NSW 2141, Lot1 DP 778492**

Dear Council,

I am writing to object to the Waste transfer Station to be built in Lidcombe as I live 800 meters away from this development. If this gets built it would have a serious impact on us and our residents' neighbourhood with the following:

**1, Traffic congestion:**

The operation of large garbage trucks will affect traffic congestion in our small residents area. As this small area is already crowded with traffic, I tend to drive into this frequently and I can't imagine this traffic with the upcoming rubbish trucks.

**2, Noise and air pollution:**

Garbage smell is harmful.

As the air is sprayed with the bad smells of the waste station, residents will constantly complain about the bad smells emanating from the pile of garbage, I often refer to this place as a little garden instead of a town and the rubbish will make its way into the flowers and plants, making them decay.

**3, Impact our property values.**

With the appearance of the waste transfer station, the passengers on passing trains will turn their heads in disgust, making Lidcombe itself lose value altogether, as people get the sense of a very big negative first impression resulting in less people coming to live here.

**4, Residential streets not affording garbage trucks to drive around.**

Heavy trucks flying around the place and coming back to one location will give the roads cracks and curves, But the Residents can't afford to pay for those damages.

**5, Overall Health**
